## **Interview summary:**

**Start 00:00** – Came to the university as a mature student in 1975. KN was interviewed by William Barnes-Gutteridge to study Psychology after previously studying English. Study was undertaken at an undergraduate level. It was felt that Stirling's flexibility with courses was a great positive.

**00:51** – KN felt that Stirling University inspired great intellectual stimulation for the students. It was also felt that there was a very friendly atmosphere between staff and students and strong feelings of equality regardless of position within the university.

**02:11** – The University was a much more politically active place during the 1970s in comparison to today. It was a very exciting place to be at the time. KN still finds the place friendly and as beautiful today as when she first arrived in the 70s.

**03:06** – KN took the position of Head of the Nursing and Midwifery Department as she had previously been a nurse. Her office was in Cottrell which she prides herself on navigating easily. Very pleased that her office overlooked the loch and Airthrey Castle.

**04:00** – There were estimated 1,000 students and 100 staff in the department to look after across the University three campuses. KN was a big believer in equality and respect between staff and students and so pushed for this in her role as head of department.

**05:13** – The Nursing and Midwifery Department at Stirling was at the time one of the first of its kind outside of an older university **[Ends 06:17]**
